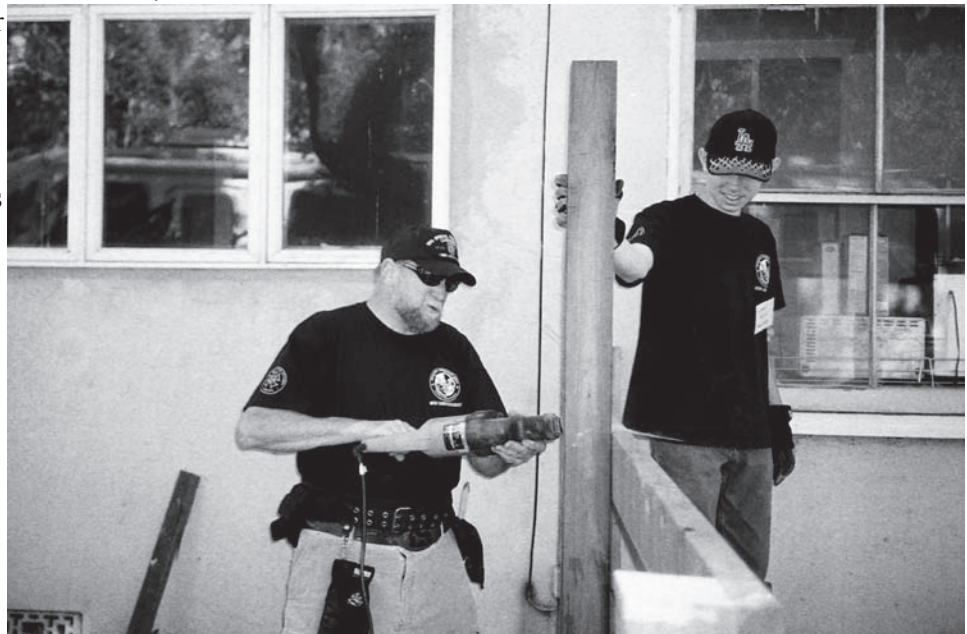

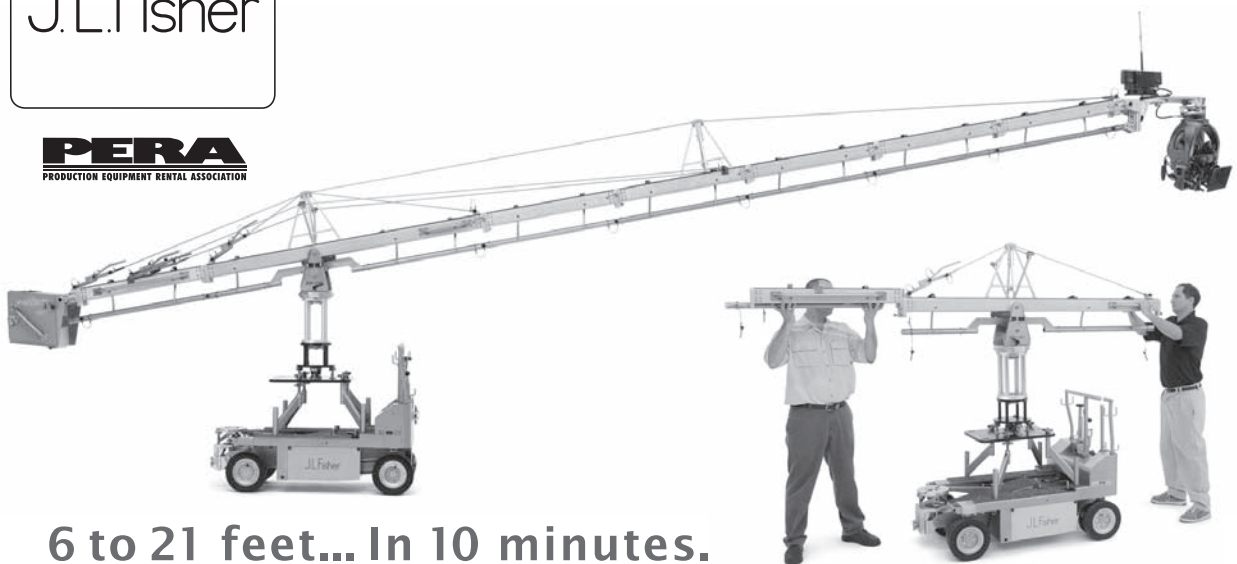

From the Desk of the Secretary-Treasurer

2006 has gotten off to a much slower than expected start. The employment surge that made 2005 the best in memory for many of Local 80's members has not continued unabated as had been generally expected. Instead, the Holiday Season slowdown has been barely mitigated by post-hiatus hiring.

The Available List continues to hover within a few members of where it was just prior to the Holidays. It goes down a few towards the end of each week, and then right back up at the beginning of the next.

The situation may soon improve rather dramatically: the Propmakers are reported to be experiencing very high employment at present, building sets for the new Pilots and Features that are going to be going into principal photography soon, probably around mid-March. This should portend a major increase in employment for Local 80's members in the near future.

If you aren't working, check with the Callboard to make absolutely sure you are on the Available List.

Ratification ballot materials for the newly negotiated Basic Agreement and Local Agreement should be in your hands by the time that you receive this issue of The Eighty News. If you haven't received your ballot, you need to call Local 80's Accounting Office as soon as possible to make sure that your correct address is on file, and your dues are current. (Bear in mind that if you paid late or reduced dues for this Quarter, your dues are not considered current until your signed blue or green (statement cards are received by Local 80.)

It would be hard to overstate the case for the importance of your vote on this ballot. The results of the negotiations far exceeded any contract negotiated in any other industry in the county in the last couple of years. At a time when workers in other industries have seen their healthcare and pension plans cut dramatically, or even totally eliminated, and their wages frozen or cut, we have lost nothing and potentially gained much.

We will keep one of the finest healthcare plans in the nation, virtually unchanged. We gain an entirely new jurisdiction: Local 80 Marine. We get decent raises, compounded over the course of the contract. We get substantial increases to our pensions through increased employer contributions. Even our

already retired members will get raises.

As is required by labor law, contract ratification ballots are secret. The votes will be counted by a Certified Public Accounting firm that must receive them not later than March 7, 2006.

If you want your vote to count, you must follow the voting instructions included with the ballot exactly.

If, on the other hand, you want your vote discarded without being counted, you can do one of the following:

Return your ballot in the provided postage-paid envelope without marking either the "For Ratification" box or the "Against Ratification" box;

Write on or otherwise mark the ballot or the ballot envelope other than marking your vote as instructed;

Change or remove your name or the number on the return envelope.

Mail your ballot on or after the deadline date for its arrival at the CPA's office;

Put your ballot into the mail slot or through the front door after business hours at Local 80;

Re-address the return envelope, or put your ballot in a different envelope. If you're feeling really ambitious, put the ballot return envelope into another envelope and mail it to Local 80. (This one and the previous one only work if you do it too late for me to drop the return envelope back into the mail to get it to the CPA's office by the March 7th deadline, though.)

No doubt you can come up with even more creative ways to waste your opportunity to have a say in your contract, but these are the tried and true methods that many of the Local's members fall back on each time a vote is conducted by mail.

Of course, if none of these techniques has any appeal, and your creativity utterly fails you, you can just save time and effort for the CPA and his staff by throwing your ballot into the trash.

Sadly, there will be members who do exactly that, and members who might as well have because they couldn't, or wouldn't, follow instructions. Please don't be one of them.

Weingarten Rights

The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that the National Labor Relations Act gives workers the right to request union representation during investigatory interviews by supervisors, security personnel, and other managerial staff. These are called Weingarten Rights

An investigatory interview occurs if:

- 1) Management questions you to obtain information; and
- 2) You have reasonable apprehension that your answers could be used as a basis for discipline or other adverse action.

You must ask for union representation either before or during an investigatory interview. Management does not have to remind you of this right.

If your request is refused and management continues asking questions, you may refuse to answer. Your employer is guilty of an unfair labor practice and charges may be filed.

If you are called to a meeting with management, read or state the following when the meeting begins:

“If this interview could in any way lead to my being disciplined or terminated, or affect my personal working conditions, I respectfully request that my union representative, officer or steward be present at this meeting. Until my representative arrives, I choose not to participate in this discussion.”

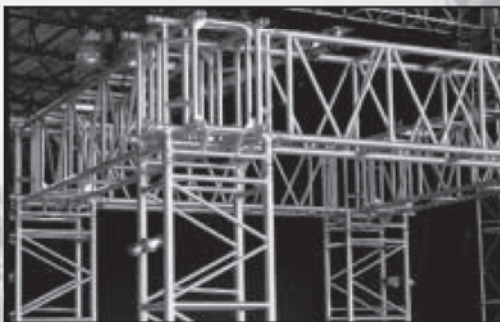
