



Know the Contract and Protect Our Jobs

Most people are expecting a big fall season. There will be a lot of work and money to be made.

It is during times like this that Members forget or giveaway our work. The jurisdictions that each craft has have been fought for over many years. We need to make sure that Local 80 Members are doing Local 80 jobs.

So why are other people doing our jobs?

It is the result of many things. One reason is we don't always know what are jobs are. How many of you have a copy of the contract let alone have read it? Yes, I know it was written by a committee of mostly lawyers. It is as exciting as a rerun of a pilot that didn't make it. Read the contract. Know your job.

Another reason is Members get lazy. They have a full plate of work and not enough people to do the things they are already doing. They then see someone doing their job. Rather than trying to figure out how to get that job done or trying to get other Local 80 Brothers and Sisters on the crew to do the work, they just let it go.

I know that not all of the jobs we have to do as part of our contract are the most glamorous. Many are mundane, boring, dirty, hard, hot, and down right unpleasant. And, when you can have your pick of work picking up after a hundred extras or carrying and scene docking a bunch of walls doesn't sound like a lot of fun. But, come February, when you're one of 200 people out of work you might like that some Key calls the hall to complain that someone is doing your job, and he needs

a Local 80 member to come in for the day.

When I was home one summer during college, I was working with my Dad on a big, commercial building. My Dad was a plumber for a long time. We were in the rest room, and he said, "You see those toilet stalls, and the towel dispensers, and the soap dispensers. That all use to be plumbers work, but we got too arrogant and thought that work was beneath us. There are plumber without jobs and someone else is doing that work now."

Never give up our work. Never just let someone else do your job. It may be inconvenient to take care of it today, but someday you may need that job. The same goes for so many of our Members that won't take a lesser contract job. "If it isn't scale," we hear in the office, "I won't do it." These are the same people who then complain that there are too many people getting into the Local. If no one takes that lesser contract job, the Local has to release the call to a permit because we are not able to fill the position. Is it really better to sit around the house so you don't mess up unemployment, then it is to earn a couple hundred dollars, put money toward retirement, money toward health benefits, and make a contact that may turn into more work in the future?

Protect your work and the work of all Local 80 Brothers and Sisters. Get a contract and read it. If you see someone else doing our job let the Local know. Sometimes there is nothing that can be done or the circumstances are correct, but if we don't protect what we have we may lose it.

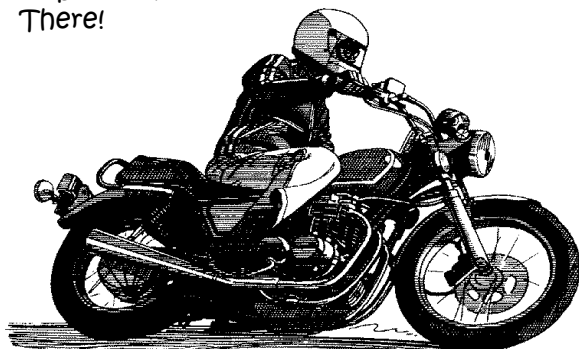

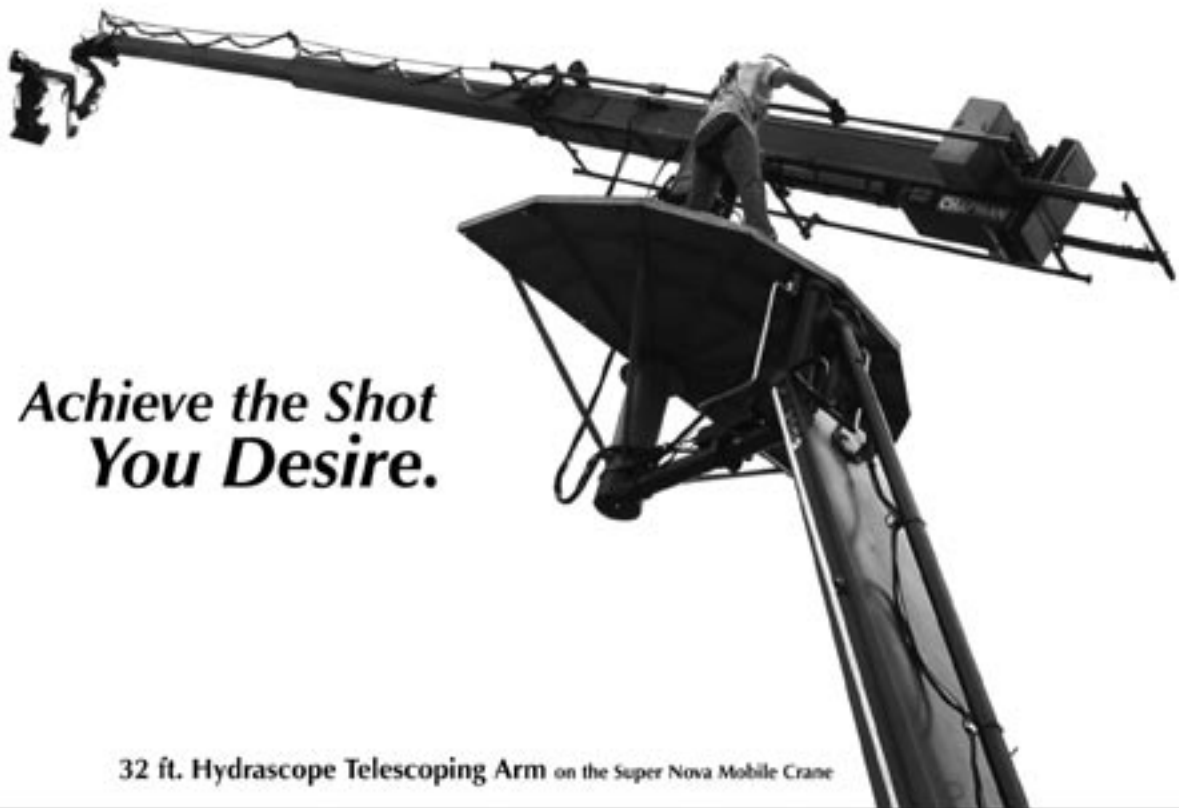

From the Desk of the Secretary-Treasurer

The annual Local 80 IATSE Building Corporation Shareholders Meeting for 2007 will be held at the same time and place as the June General Meeting. (If you are a member in good standing of Local 80, you are also a shareholder in the Local 80 IATSE Building Corporation. Try not to get more excited than the situation actually warrants, though; you can't sell your share.) For those who missed it in May, or for those who are simply gluttons for punishment, the 2006 Consolidated Audit may be read again, though only if it is requested. If no one is in a masochistic mood, the financial report will consist of the reading of Local 80's May year-to-date figures, which will be the latest available.

The Local 80 Retiree Prescription Co-Payment Reimbursement Plan recently ran into a new and unforeseen problem: Sav-on Drugs has apparently decided to save on receipt printing by using plain-paper laser printers that produce receipts that are virtually indistinguishable from photocopies of the old-style receipts. Since the rules of the program require that original receipts not photocopies, be submitted, there was a certain amount of confusion, initially. That confusion was further compounded by retirees who, for reasons best known to themselves, were cutting their receipts into their component parts instead of submitting the entire sheet of paper.

Fortunately, the accounting staff was able to figure out what was wrong, as well as how to work around it, in fairly short order, so only a handful of people had to resubmit wrongly rejected receipts.

Unfortunately, the solution entails still more work for the accounting staff. The extra work has not, as yet, dramatically increased the cost of continuing the program, but neither is that cost negligible.

There is really very little that Local 80's retirees can actually do to keep the cost to Local 80 of the Local 80 Retiree Prescription Co-Payment Reimbursement Plan down: after all, if the doctor says you need the medicine, you need it. If you don't believe that, why are you wasting time going to the doctor in the first place? (Keeping the costs to the participants and the Plans down, on the other hand, is pretty straightforward: eat right and exercise to improve your general health, and, when you do need medicine, use Medco's prescription-by-mail service

instead of your local pharmacy whenever possible.)

What can be done by participants to keep the cost to Local 80 of processing receipts to the bare minimum is actually to avoid doing things that raise the cost of processing. Things like sending several small batches of receipts each quarter, instead of saving them all up and submitting them at the same time. Or, cutting up receipts into their component parts, instead of submitting the entire sheet exactly as it came from the pharmacy. (This, by the way, can result in a participant being permanently excluded from the program; something that nobody wants to see happen. Nonetheless, if the second parts of cut-up two-part receipts are, whether accidentally or not, later submitted for a second reimbursement, no more receipts will be processed for that participant.)

Another thing to be carefully avoided is submitting receipts for anyone other than the retiree or the spouse of the retiree. No one else, even if they are wholly dependent upon the participant, is covered by the Local's co-pay plan.

With the Pilot season over, the number of members who are listed as Available is still climbing as this is being written, and seems likely to continue to climb for at least a few more weeks.

An idle period at this time of year is certainly nothing out of the ordinary, but, then, this is not an ordinary year; this year there is a looming possibility of job actions by the Writers and/or Actors Guilds in the relatively near future. With that in mind, it is difficult to see just why the Producers are not working right on through this period without pause, trying to get as much product in the cans as possible, just in case.

Don't let the apparent carefree optimism of the Producers lull you into overconfidence. If the WGA or SAG do walk out, you are going to need to be able to outlast a strike waged by a group of people who (with very few exceptions) don't make their primary living by writing or acting.

If you are one of the fortunate few who are still working, put away as much money as you can. If you aren't working, don't spend a penny more than necessary until WGA and SAG contracts are actually signed.

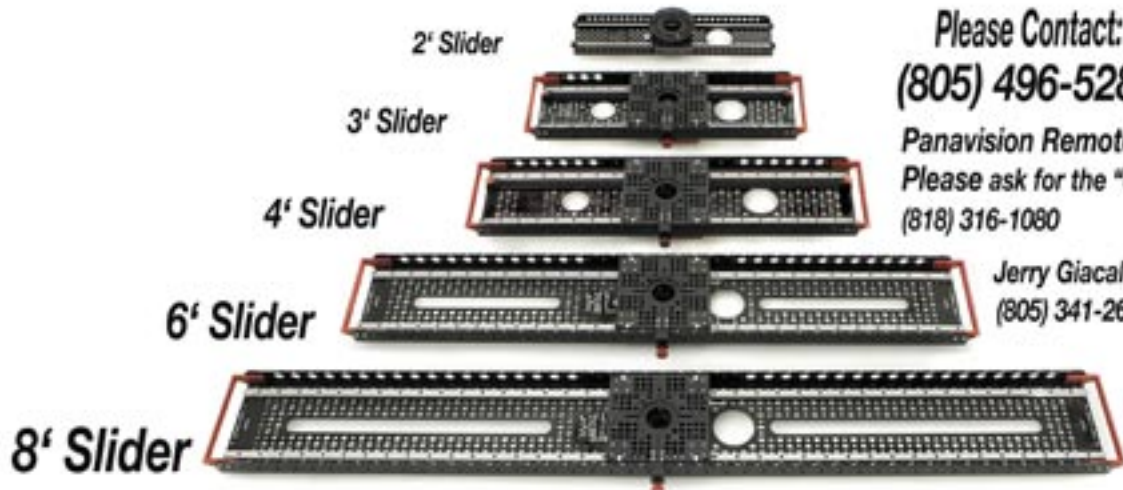

Local 80 Retiree Rx Co-Payment Reimbursement Plan Update

As of August 1, 2006, when the current Basic Agreement went into effect, the cost of prescription co-payments increased substantially. Despite this, Local 80's officers and membership have decided to continue their voluntary program of reimbursing Local 80 retirees' qualified co-payment costs in accordance with the formula in use prior to the change for another year.

Therefore, for prescriptions filled under the new contract, the reimbursements will be as follows:

- The program will fully reimburse the co-payment for a three month supply purchased through the Industry Health Plan mail-in provider (still Medco). Medco co-payments are: \$10 for generic drugs, \$30 for preferred brand drugs, and \$36 for all other brands.
- Retirees who do not use the mail-in service can only get a one-month supply. The program will reimburse only an amount equivalent to the cost of Medco service: \$3.33 for generic, \$10 for preferred-brand drugs, and \$12 for all other brands.

The rest of the policy will also remain in effect for another year:

- Only those retirees that inform the Local of their retirement, and who choose to continue their relationship with Local 80 by remaining current on dues as a Plan #1, Plan #2 or Plan #3 Retiree will be eligible for the program, as will their spouses or domestic partners who are covered by the Industry Health Plan (the retired member must inform the Local in writing of their spouse or partner's name.)
- The program can only accept original receipts less than one year old. (The age of receipts will be measured in relation to the beginning of the quarter in which they are submitted, as determined by the postmark.)
- Co-payment requests will be handled on a quarterly basis. There will be four deadlines for submitting receipts each year: February 1st, May 1st, August 1st and November 1st. Checks will be issued by March 15th, June 15th, Sept 15th, and December 15th. (Submissions received after a deadline will be processed with the next quarter's receipts.)
