



Dues Deferment Enacted to Help Deflect Writer's Strike Effects

The Executive Board of the Local passed the following motion to help the membership with the aftermath of the Writer's strike.

That I.A.T.S.E. Local 80, in recognition of the hardships experienced by its membership due to the strike by the Writers Guild Of America against the A.M.P.T.P., shall adopt a policy regarding the payment of quarterly dues for the time period set forth in Nos. 3 & 4 following, and

Additionally, in recognition that the Local does not have the authority to waive or forgive dues owed, and must remain in compliance with the Constitution of the Local and the I.A.T.S.E., the term deferred in this instance shall mean the payment of monies that are normally and customarily owed only to the Local, which are to be paid at a future date in installments, and

That such deferment shall be allowed to all members who apply and are qualified as given below; and

1) For all qualified members of this Local, dues in excess of \$50.00 per quarter shall be deferred until a date as set forth in 3 and 4 below, and

That, a qualified member shall be defined as a member of this Local who was current on all financial obligations to the Local through the fourth quarter of 2007. (This is not to include any fines, or fees, of which the member is not aware or which is on appeal), and the members earnings do not exceed \$10,000 in the preceding quarter, and

That, thirty days prior to the end of the deferral period the Local shall advise the member of the total amount held against their account (owed), and the minimum amount to be paid and the dates and intervals in which payments must be made, and

2) That, the dues deferral policy shall begin on the first day of the second quarter (April 1) of 2008, and

3) That, the dues deferral policy shall be terminated 210 days (seven months) following the ratification of the agreement between the WGA and the AMPTP, and

4) That, members who have had their dues obligation deferred shall be obligated to make payments deferred amount in one hundred dollar (\$100) increments in conjunction with their quarterly dues, and

5) That, the member shall supply and be obligated to update the following information to the Local on a form to be supplied by the Local which shall include:

- a) The current address of the member
- b) The current phone number of the member (Home, or Cell)
- c) The last date of employment of the member
- d) The name of the last employer, along with the Payroll Company
- e) The availability status of the member must be recorded with the Local 80

f) In order to remain eligible the member must notify the Local of any changes of employment status within 24 hours of such change.

The newsletter also runs a classified section. Just email the information you want to appear, send five dollars to the Local, and your ad will appear for three issues.

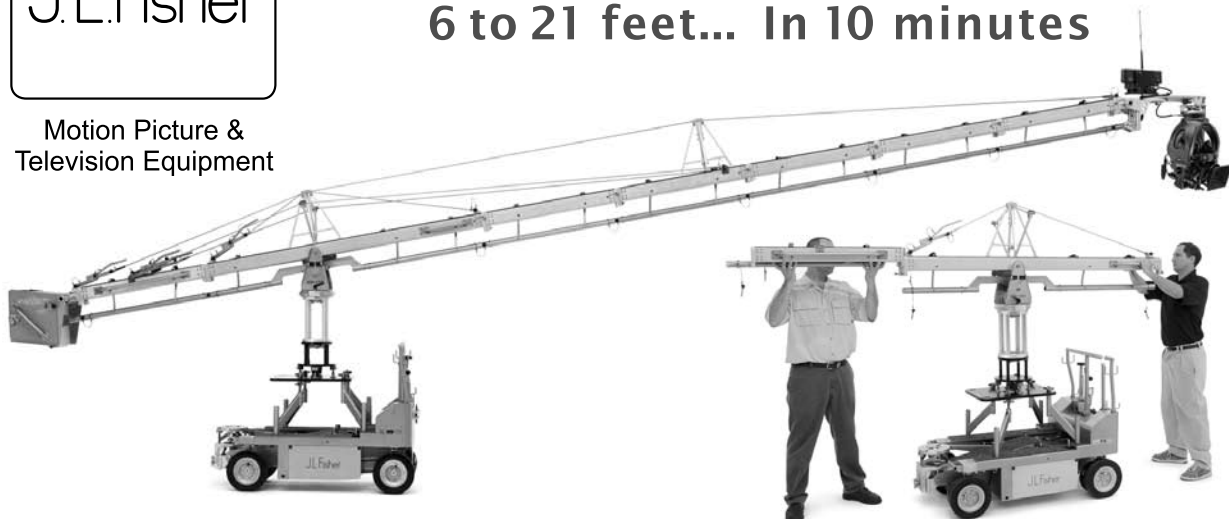

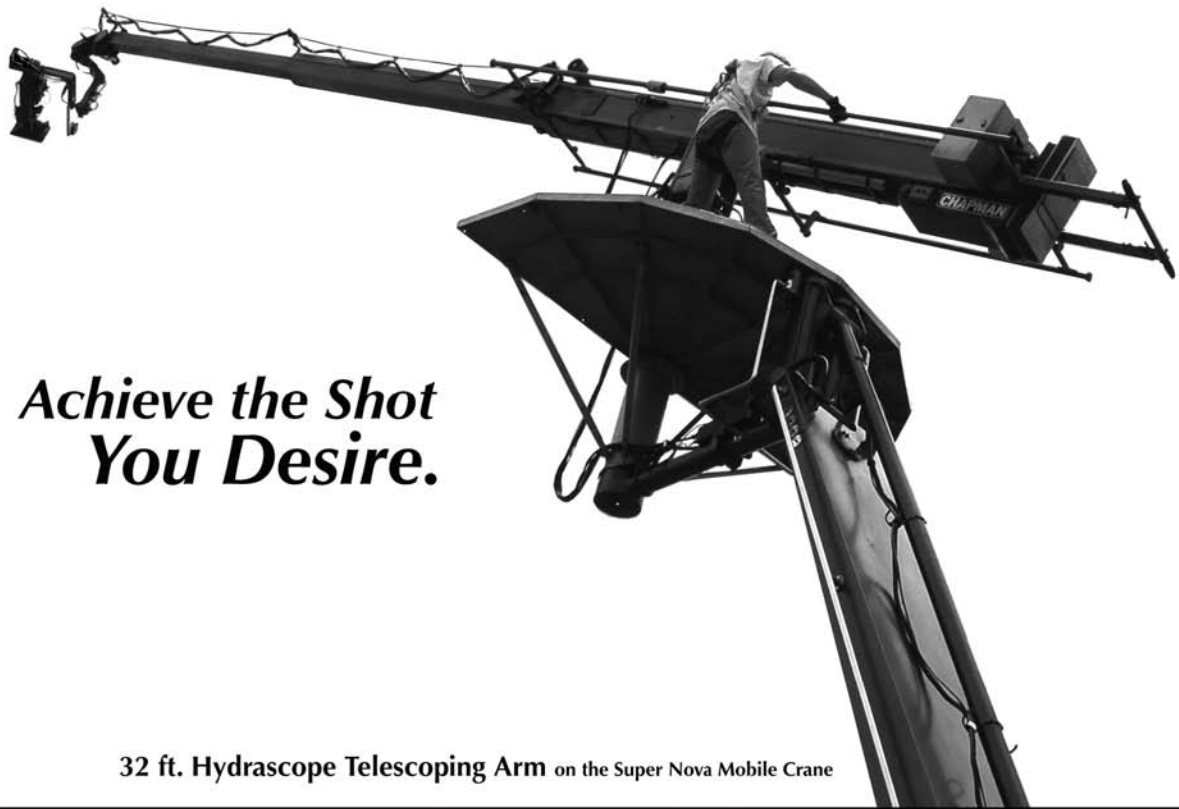

From the Desk of the Secretary-Treasurer

Second-quarter dues (still \$200.00, if you had the very good fortune to earn enough during the Writers' strike to have to pay full dues) are due not later than midnight, March 31, 2008. If you intend to pay by credit card, please call in a few days ahead of the deadline; your credit card bill will arrive on the same day whether you pay your dues at the last minute or not, so you lose nothing by paying a little early. On the other hand, helping to spread Accounting's workload out a bit by calling in early will gain you friends, and will greatly reduce your chances of being kept on hold for twenty minutes (or more) while other last-minute callers are being helped. (By the way, just a probably futile note for the incurably dense: since calls are handled in the order that they are received, hanging up and calling back puts you back at the end of the phone queue, not at the front of the line. Calling me, the Call Stewards or the Business Agents to complain that you've been put on hold for twenty minutes several times merely serves to give us a good laugh at your expense, not to gain you any sympathy. Next time, call before the last minute.)

Because of the Writers' strike, there are a great many members who owe less than full dues, including a few who paid full dues in advance. If you are one of that paid-in-advance group, don't panic; you can easily have your excess dues credited forward toward future quarters. All it takes is a phone call to the Accounting Department and your signature on a couple of cards that they will mail to you, and you are all set.

For those who didn't pay in advance, but who earned less than \$10,000 in the first quarter of 2008 and who were current on dues on December 31, 2007, there is a Dues Deferral Application form in this issue of *The Eighty News* that will allow you to defer all but \$50.00 of your second-quarter dues for seven months. (The program is not for the first quarter: you need to have those dues paid before you are eligible for deferral of your second-quarter dues. There was a form in the February issue, also: if you mailed that one to the Local before the last week of March, you will need to submit a new one.)

Please don't waste your time (or that of the Accounting Department staff) by mailing in the Dues Deferral Application form if you were not current on dues on December 31st even if you became current later: you are not eligible under that program.

If you didn't pay your first quarter dues because

you wanted to save your money as long as possible during the strike, it is now time to pay them. If you go beyond the end of the quarter without paying first quarter dues, your membership will be suspended, even if you haven't worked a single day since your dues were last current.

With the Writers' strike now a thing of the past there will be a temptation (at least for those who were lucky enough to have not have suffered complete financial devastation during the strike) to let their financial guard down. Don't fall for it.

The effects of the strike on the work situation in our industry will linger on for an unknown period. Sadly, that period is far more likely to be measured in months than in days or weeks. There will be some work soon, of course, just as there was some work during the strike, but full employment is probably not just around the corner.

It is important that you actively hunt for whatever work may develop, rather than just waiting to be called. Make sure that you are still on the Available List, and call in each morning to get on the Ready List for the day.

Whatever money you are able to earn should go to paying off debt, then into savings against the possibility of another work stoppage.

As appalling as it is to contemplate, the possibility of an Actors' strike being called this year simply can not be safely ignored.

The Screen Actors Guild has not taken any official position of which I am aware at the time of this writing, but there has been public talk from at least one of their officers that would indicate that SAG is not going to merely settle for a contract that is based on the framework established by what the Writers were finally able to achieve based on the Directors' excellent groundwork.

Until the Actors have signed a new contract, do whatever it takes to avoid letting yourself get caught with your savings down.

There are various aid programs still available to Local 80's members, whether your financial distress was caused entirely by the Writers' strike, or by some other cause entirely. One of those programs may fit your situation perfectly.

Call the Local and ask for help if you need it. Don't miss out on whatever assistance may be available to you because you were too bashful to pick up the phone and ask for it.

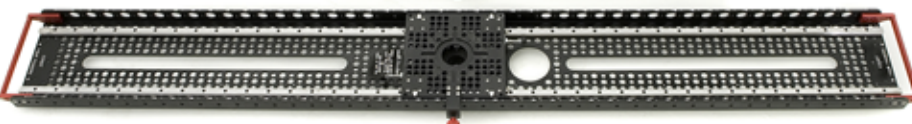

Real Estate News

Home sales in San Fernando Valley plunged during October as buyers waited to see what will happen in the home loan market and for resale to fall. Single Family home sales throughout San Fernando Valley during October plunged 54.1% compared to the prior year. Local 80 Retiree Rx Co-Payment Reimbursement Plan Update

As of August 1, 2006, when the current Basic Agreement went into effect, the cost of prescription co-payments increased substantially. Despite this, Local 80's officers and membership have decided to continue their voluntary program of reimbursing Local 80 retirees' qualified co-payment costs in accordance with the formula in use prior to the change for another year. Therefore, for prescriptions filled under the new contract, the reimbursements will be as follows:

- The program will fully reimburse the co-payment for a three month supply purchased through the Industry Health Plan mail-in provider (still Medco). Medco co-payments are: \$10 for generic drugs, \$30 for preferred brand drugs, and \$36 for all other brands.
- Retirees who do not use the mail-in service can only get a one-month supply. The program will reimburse only an amount equivalent to the cost of Medco service: \$3.33 for generic, \$10 for preferred-brand drugs, and \$12 for all other brands.

The rest of the policy will also remain in effect for another year:

- Only those retirees that inform the Local of their retirement, and who choose to continue their relationship with Local 80 by remaining current on dues as a Plan #1, Plan #2 or Plan #3 Retiree will be eligible for the program, as will their spouses or domestic partners who are covered by the Industry Health Plan (the retired member must inform the Local in writing of their spouse or partner's name.)
- The program can only accept original receipts less than one year old. (The age of receipts will be measured in relation to the beginning of the quarter in which they are submitted, as determined by the postmark.)
- Co-payment requests will be handled on a quarterly basis. There will be four deadlines for submitting receipts each year: February 1st, May 1st, August 1st and November 1st. Checks will be issued by March 15th, June 15th, Sept 15th, and December 15th. (Submissions received after a deadline will be processed with the next quarter's receipts.)
